### History

Anarchist periodical started in 1886 by a group of friends around Peter Kropotkin after their separation from the English Anarchist Circle and *The Anarchist* edited by Henry Seymour; in addition to *Freedom*, the group eventually set up the Freedom Press, the main publisher of anarchist literature in England; first editors of *Freedom* were Charlotte M. Wilson 1886-1895, Alfred Marsh 1895-1912 and Thomas H. Keell 1912-1932; among the contributors to the periodical were George Bernard Shaw, Max Nettlau and Kropotkin; a rival *Freedom* was published by opponents of Th. Keell, including John Turner and Oscar Swede 1930-1936; ceased publication in favour of *Spain and the World* 1936-1938, edited by Vernon Richards, and changed its name to *Revolt* in 1939; this was continued as *War Commentary*, renamed *Freedom* in 1945, the publication of which continues still today.

### Content

### Arrangement

The archives were collected by Heiner Becker in the period 1978-2000; there are supplements to be expected in the near future; he also arranged the main part of the material; this list was made on the basis of his descriptions.

Because of the bad condition of the papers and packing materials the IISH decided to pack the papers in acid free covers, folders and boxes without changing anything in the order; the order of this list follows the order of the original stacks where the boxes were stored; the original boxes which were found in these stacks are mentioned (including the original inscriptions); followed by a description of the content which is re-packed; the numbers 1-271 were found in stacks 4420.1-2 - 4421.1-6; numbers 272-339 were found in stack 3459.1-6; numbers 340-532 were found in stacks 4434-4436.
