# Persons

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*Sixto Carlos, Jr. dressed up as mineworker ready to go down the mines in Fushun, China. Sixto was part of a group of 15 Filipino delegates (mainly UP Student Council members and some faculty) who were invited by the All China Youth Federation for a visit. The original invitation was for the whole UP Student Council (40 members) but since the Philippines had no diplomatic ties with China the trip came under heavy political scrutiny and was finally temporarily abandoned. A year later (1967) a much smaller delegation went on private invitations. China at that time went through the Great Cultural Revolution.*

Simon Sobron Aidit; born in Tanjung Pandan, Belitung, Sumatra, Indonesia 1934, died in Paris 2007; writer and poet, brother of PKI-leader D.N. Aidit; teacher in Jakarta, Indonesia 1954-1963; left in 1964 for China, where he worked as professor at the Institut Bahasa Asing Beijing and as editor and presenter of Radio Beijing in Bahasa Indonesia; after the coup d'état of 1965 it was impossible for him to return to Indonesia and therefore he stayed for a longer time in China; from 1981 in exile in Paris; visited frequently the Netherlands.

Diary 1969-1982; correspondence (mainly by e-mail) 1997-2000; typescripts and some manuscripts of poems, articles and essays from the period 1950-2003; documentation 2005.

## 3. Bing, Harald F.

Born in Croydon, England 1897, died in East Leakes, Leicestershire 1975; as conscientious objector imprisoned during 1916-1919; one of the founders of Paco, forerunner of the War Resisters' International (WRI); from 1925 member of the International Advisory Council of the WRI; head of the National Committee and Youth Section of the No More War Movement 1923-1937; from 1937 sponsor of the Peace Pledge Union (PPU); lecturer for the WRI and writer of its history, published in *The Pacifist*.

## 4. Carlos, Sixto

**Period:** 1965-2006

**Total size:** 0.12 m.

**Consultation:** Restricted

Born in Pandacan, Manila, Philippines 1947; instructor of Political Science and the life and teachings of Jose Rizal at the Philippine College of Commerce 1969-1971; head of the Political Science Department of the Philippine College of Commerce 1970-1971; national officer of the activist national youth organization Kabataang Makabayan (Nationalist Youth) 1965-

1967; co-founder of the activist national youth organization Samahan ng Demokratikong Kabataan-SDK (League of Democratic Youth) 1967-1971; member of the Communist Party of the Philippines 1971-1992; member of the CPP Central Committee 1975-1992, head of the CPP national democratic front commission 1977-1979; head of the CPP International Department 1984-1992; representative for Europe of the National Democratic Front 1984-1992; political prisoner under the Marcos dictatorship 1979-1983; adopted and supported by Amnesty International Netherlands as a political prisoner; lived after his release as a political refugee in the Netherlands 1984-1996; returned later to the Philippines; worked with human rights community in the Philippines through Balay Rehabilitation Center 1996-2001; member of Akbayan! Citizens Action Party from 1999, member of its national executive committee 2004-2007 and International Secretary 2001-2007.

Identity papers 1998 and n.d.; letters asking for his release from prison 1981-1983; drawings by children of political prisoners 1981; file on removal of his name from the Plaza Miranda Bombing (August 21, 1971) blacklist 1971-1972.

Born in 1936; studied medicine (not finished); active in the student movement and editor of *Demokrater*, the magazine of the Nederlandse Studenten Vakbeweging (Dutch Student Union); journalist, editor of Dutch independent weekly *Groene Amsterdammer*; involved with editing and publishing of the *Vietnam Bulletin. Informatiebulletin voor Zuidoost-Azië* and with the *Medisch Comitee Nederland-Vietnam (Medical Committee Netherlands-Vietnam)*; published on the *Vietnam-Tribunal* in Stockholm and Roskilde in 1967.

Records concerning the Vietnam-bulletin, the *Medisch Comitee Nederland-Vietnam* and other Vietnam actions; documentation and other articles about Asia.

**7. Viktor Kaisiëpo (1948-2010)****Period: 1988, 2007-2010****Size: 0.12 m.****Consultation: Not restricted**

Born in Korido, Biak, Nederlands Nieuw-Guinea 1948; leader of the Papua's both in the Netherlands as well as in Papua; grew up in Hollandia (later Jayapura); departed for the Netherlands 1962; worked for Asepta, a company for herbicides 1967-1984; broke away from the Reformed Papua Community in the Netherlands; involved with the Fourth Russell Tribunal in Rotterdam (November 1980) and with the struggle of Indigenous Peoples; project leader of the Nederlands Centrum voor Inheemse Volken (Dutch Center for Indigenous Peoples) 1993; influential lobbyist with the United Nations; first return in thirtyeight years in 2000, after that several other trips follow; until his death on 31 January 2010 involved with the political struggle of the Papua's. In 2011 'Viktor Kaisiëpo Msn. Een perspectief voor Papoea. Het verhaal van mijn leven en strijd', opgetekend door Willem Campschreur = Viktor Kaisiëpo Msn. A Perspective for Papua. The Story of My Life and Struggle', written down by Willem Campschreur (Amsterdam: KIT Publishers, 2011) was published.

Born in Dehra Dun, India 1921; studied at Rabindranath Tagore's university at Shantiniketan; worked with Mahatma Gandhi from 1944 to 1947; worked for Nayee Talim (Gandhi's radical education programme) as a teacher and artist in Sevagram Ashram, established by Gandhi, until 1962; participated in the non-violence social reform movements in India from Independence onwards; General Secretary of the War Resisters' International 1962-1972 and its President 1973-1975; during his time at the WRI significant changes took place: while still concentrating on the work for conscientious objection it widened its scope of work to nonviolence training and nonviolent action against armaments and war; lives in Delhi since 1983, teaching, making pottery and writing; author of *War is a crime against humanity : the Story of War Resisters' International* (2005).

**12. Putter, Jan Petrus de**

**Period: 1926-2007**

**Size: 0.12 m.**

**Consultation: No restrictions**

Jan Petrus de Putter; born May 19, 1908 in Terneuzen, Zeeuws-Vlaanderen, deceased November 30, 1944 in Muntok, Sumatra, Netherlands-Indies; from 1926 he followed the training as Indies' civil-servant; administrative civil-servant in the function of candidate-controller, later controller with the 'Binnenlandsch Bestuur' (Domestic Civil Service) on Java (Bandoeng) and later Sumatra (a.o. Bengkalis, Moeara Tembesi, Djambi and Riouw Archipelago as stations), Netherlands-Indies from 1932; followed the orders of the Netherlands-Indies Government to stay put while the rest of the family fled to Java; during the Japanese occupation De Putter and his family landed in separate camps; De Putter passes away at the end of 1944, his wife and three daughters survive.

NB. The life of De Putter and his family members has been set out by Ineke de Putter in '*Sago op een timmen bord*'. An adaptation from the archive of Jan Petrus de Putter, civil-servant in the Netherlands-Indies from 1932 until 1944, supplemented by written and oral recollections from his wife and children (2005).

Luzviminda A. Santos was with the CPP from 1977 up to the split in 1992. Been assigned as semi-legal cader in northcentral mindanao from 1977-1983; back to Davao as finance staff for the Mindanao Commission, and after her arrest in Nov. 1987, was sent to Manila and with the homefront bureau (Int'L Dept.) until 1992 (split). Been a development worker since 1975 up to present with the following advocacies: human rights, foreign debt, soc-feminism and fair trade. Present: National Council member of Akbayan, Freedom from Debt Coalition, PATH (Peace Advocate for Truth, Healing and Justice)

#### 17. Thomas, Albert

**Period: 1928-1929**

**Total size: 0.12 m.**

**Consultation: Not restricted**

Born in Champigny-sur-Marne, France 1878, died in Paris 1932; French socialist politician; elected to the Chamber of Deputies 1910; Under-Secretary for Munitions at the War Ministry 1915; promoted to full ministerial status 1916; in the wake of the February Revolution of 1917 despatched as a special ambassador to Petrograd to encourage continued Russian participation in the war against the Central Powers 1917; resigned September 1917; attended the Paris Peace Conference and helped to draw up relevant provisions of the Treaty of Versailles; first director of the League of Nations' International Labour Organization 1919-1932; spent a good deal of time travelling in order to seek support for the objectives and functions of the ILO.

Born in Pakis near Tumpang, East Java, Indonesia 1928; journalist working for the newspapers Indonesia Raya 1950-1953, Harian Rakyat 1953-1956, Harian Penerangan 1956-1960 and Ekonomi Nasional 1960-1965; officer of the Jakarta based secretariat of the Association of Asian and African Journalists (PWAA) and treasurer of the centrale office of the Association of Indonesian Journalists (PWI) 1963-1965; abroad during the coup d'etat by Suharto 1965; stayed in Chile, Algeria and Paris but left for Beijing; stay in China 1965-1973; secretariat of the PWAA moved to Beijing; left for Paris and found a job at the Ministry of Agriculture 1975-1982; also active in the French Tapol Committee from 1974; co-founded restaurant 'Indonesia', run by the cooperative SCOP Fraternité, in 1982; editor and later owner of Chine Express and Business with China, issued by China Documentation and Communication from 1986.

Born 1903, deceased 1992; market gardener in Andijk; member of the Communist Party Netherlands (CPN); Gerrit de Vries was, together with Annie van Ommeren-Averink and Gerard Maas, part of a CPN-delegation who visited the People's Republic of China from November 20, 1956 until January 24, 1957.

Annie Averink, Gerard Maas and Gerrit de Vries together wrote 'China werpt het juk af' (Amsterdam: Pegasus, 1958) (Bibliotheek IISG Az 829/807).

The 'Archiv Soldatenrechte', now the collection Brünn-Harris-Watts, intended to collect materials about soldiers in active service and their rights and organizations; during several decades a large collection of books, periodicals, leaflets, posters and other materials was collected; the collection was built up by Wolf Dieter Brünn (1951-2010), David Harris (1938-2006) and Max Watts, born as Tomi Schwaetzer in Vienna, (1928-2010); Brünn studied political sciences, was a squatter in the Görlitzer Strasse in Berlin-Kreuzberg and was the archivist of this trio; Harris founded and ran the GI-Counselling-Center in Berlin since 1974; Watts fled with his father in the 1930s to London, went to New York 1944, went later to Israel and Paris, started his contacts with deserting GI's in 1966-1967, started the RITA (Resistance Inside The Army); organized for deserting American soldiers an underground journey from Germany via Amsterdam to Paris, where deserted American soldiers were not prosecuted; banned by French authorities to Corsica, fled to Dilsberg near Heidelberg and settled in West-Berlin, left 1981 for Australia, where he was supporting the Aborigines.

Beside collecting the 'Archiv Soldatenrechte' issued a lot of publications as *Widerstand in der US-Armee*, *Soldiers in Revolt* and *Left Face*; many titles were issued by the Harald Kater-Verlag, the publication house run by Dieter Brünn.

Underground materials, soldiers periodicals, like RITA (Resistance Inside The Army) and *The Bond*, from many countries, studies and other documents on the army, soldiers and their rights and organizations 1965-2010.

The enormous collection was stored in the private home of Dieter Brünn in Berlin; after the death of Brünn in April 2010 his living had to be delivered clean and empty; a big part of the materials was transferred to the IISH in Amsterdam, where it awaits for cataloguing.

**30. Burma Peace Foundation (Geneva)****Period: 1987-2007****Total Size: 18.85 m.****Consultation: Restricted**

A new acquisition to add to our Burmese holdings: the collection of the Burma Peace Foundation. The Burma Peace Foundation (BPF) was formed in London in 1987 by David Arnott and U Rewata Dhamma, a Burmese Buddhist monk, initially to act as a mediating body between the generals in Rangoon and the non-Burman ethnic groups. Its first concrete activity, however, was to bring money, malaria medicine and moral support to the students and monks who had fled to the Thailand-Burma border in the wake of the suppression of 1988. From 1991 to 1996, it was based in New York where it acted as a conduit for human rights and other information on Burma from the monitors in the field to the UN and other actors and from 1996 to 2007 it carried out similar activities in Geneva. In 2001 BPF launched the Online Burma/Myanmar Library (OBL) (<http://www.burmalibrary.org>) which is now the Internet's largest single depository of online material on Burma/Myanmar, with over 15,000 full-text documents, including a number of unique archives. From 2005, BPF established an office in Mae Sot, Thailand, in parallel with the Geneva office, and in 2007 gave up the Geneva base in order to concentrate on activities in the region.

In the course of these 20 years, BPF/OBL has accumulated a paper and electronic archive dealing with a wide range of issues relating to Burma. A large proportion of the documents relate to multilateral, bilateral and transnational involvement with the country and include not only official documents (which may also be found elsewhere) but also working papers, different stages of draft resolutions etc. Access to the collection is restricted.

The Institute acquired a complete set of the records of the Central Zone Commission (CZC) and the All Island Commission (AIC) of Inquiry into Disappearances of Persons in Sri Lanka. In 1995 Sri Lanka's President Chandrika Bandaranayake appointed three Commissions of Inquiry known as the Zonal Commissions. These Commissions had a mandate to inquire into incidents of disappearances in and after 1988. In 1998 another commission was appointed with island-wide jurisdiction, the All Island Commission (AIC). The AIC however was only authorized to inquire into complaints which were left un-inquired by the Zonal Commissions. The records brought together by these Commissions are a unique and valuable repository

of information on Human Rights violations in Sri Lanka during and after the Janatha Vimukthi Peramuna (JVP) uprising from 1987-1989.

The Confederation of Iranian Students was a new chapter in the activities of Iranian students outside Iran; played a major role through its wide contacts with the mass media in showing the government of Mohammed Reza Shah as a suppressing regime; during the decades of 1960s and 1970s the Confederation with its large branches in the United States and in Europe presented itself as the most active and wide opposition organization outside Iran; the Confederation asked much attention for the political prisoners in Iran; after the 16th annual congress in 1975 the Confederation was divided in various groups; after the Islamic revolution of 1979 the members of the Confederation returned home and no new students were sent abroad, therefore the Confederation lost its existence abroad.

Anarchist periodical started in 1886 by a group of friends around Peter Kropotkin after their separation from the English Anarchist Circle and The Anarchist edited by Henry Seymour; in addition to Freedom, the group eventually set up the Freedom Press, the main publisher of anarchist literature in England; first editors of Freedom were Charlotte M. Wilson 1886-1895, Alfred Marsh 1895-1912 and Thomas H. Keell 1912-1932; among the contributors to the periodical were George Bernard Shaw, Max Nettlau and Kropotkin; a rival Freedom was published by opponents of Th. Keell, including John Turner and Oscar Swede 1930-1936; ceased publication in favour of Spain and the World 1936-1938, edited by Vernon Richards, and changed its name to Revolt in 1939; this was continued as War Commentary, renamed Freedom in 1945, the publication of which continues still today.

**42. Garden Streams (Hong Kong)**

In response to the needs of Vietnamese boat people residing in detention camps, Evelyn Liang yee Woo organized the "Art in the Camp" project, supported by the UNHCR and also the International Rescue Funds from New York. She was also one of the pioneers of community art in Hong Kong, and was founder of the Art Function Group and the "Garden Streams – Hong Kong Fellowship of Christian Artists" in the 1980s. Last organization kept the artworks for many years and organized several exhibitions with them in Hong Kong.

Collection of around 800 pieces of artwork made by Vietnamese and Chinese-Vietnamese refugees who fled from Vietnam in the late-seventies and were kept in Refugee Detention Camps in Hong Kong. The collection also holds additional documentation on life in the camps (pictures, audio-interviews etc.)

The Organization of the Iranian People's Feda'I Guerilla (Sazman-e Charikh-ye Feda'I-ye Khalq-e Iran) was formed in the 1960s by the clandestine Marxist-Leninist circles of Iran; they adopted an armed resistance and confrontation with the existing regime in Iran; OIPFG made its existence known by an armed incursion at the Siahkal Gendarmerie post in 1971; most of the leaders of the organization were killed or executed either during armed confrontations or after persecutions, and some of them were imprisoned; after the Islamic Revolution of 1979 the OIPFG changed its status and begun its activities as a non-clandestine organization; however, after some time it faced internal crises and splits; finally following the OIPFG's dissolution of 1980 the organization was divided into different organizations, the Aksaryat (Majority) and Aqualiat (Minority) with two different policies.

The Parti Sosialis Malaysia (PSM), also known as the Socialist Party of Malaysia, was formed officially in 1998 but had its front organizations before as Alaigal, Community Development Centre (CDC) and Suara Warga Pertiwi (SWP); in 1995, after the Malaysian General Election, there was an attempt to form a left political party, the organizations and groups involved in drafting a socialist party constitution were called the Socialist Popular Front (SPF); the PSM filled the vacuum after the last socialist party in Malaysia, the Parti Sosialis Rakyat Malaysia, stripped the word socialist from their name and constitution in 1990; the PSM was officially registered as a political party on the eve of Labour Day, 1998; the Malaysian federal government refused to recognize PSM, however, and rejected PSM's application to register as a political party, alleging that PSM is a threat to national security; two adherents of PSM were elected to parliament; in June 2008, PSM obtained approval from the Home Ministry to register as a political party after a 10-year battle which included a protracted law suit against the government.

torture survivors, families, relatives and friends of victims missing or executed during the anti-infiltration campaigns within the Communist Party of the Philippines-New People's Army (CCP-NPA) in the 1980s, PATH seeks truth and justice from the CPP-NPA and other Left blocs whose leaders were involved in the anti-infiltration campaigns.

**66. 'Say Hi To The Leaders' (Thailand)**

**Period: 2010**

**Consultation: Restricted**

During the Red Shirt street protests at the Ratchaprasong intersection (Bangkok, Thailand) in April–May 2010, a sort of message-board was created where people could leave notes with messages to the Red Shirt leaders. On top of the message board a sign was posted 'Say Hi to the Leaders' (in English) The construction consisted of a wooden frame with plastic boards nailed onto it and a small wooden shelf beneath it to write on. Pens and post-it notes were provided. The notes were attached to the plastic board with pins. It was situated (but maybe not all the time) against the tourist booth on the corner of Thanon Ratchadamri and Thanon Phloen Chit near the Gaysorn mall.

All together there are 1098 messages in this collection. The total collection was bigger, but some messages apparently were lost during transport. Also we don't know the date when the board went up and if it has been emptied in

between to show the messages to the leaders. The exact number of messages will never be known, but at least this collection gives an indication of the sentiments amongst the protesters. The great majority of the messages is in Thai, some are written in English either by Thai people or foreign visitors, and some are in other languages.

The collection will become available later in 2011.

**67. Sazman-i Mojahedin-i Khalq Iran**

**Period: 1971-1986**

The Sazman-i Mojahedin-i Khalq Iran (Peoples Mojahedin Organization of Iran) was clandestinely founded by three students who were members of the Nehzat-e Azadi Iran (Freedom Movement of Iran) in 1966; the new organization adopted the ideology of Islam and armed struggle as its theoretical and practical guide; in 1971 the Sazman-i Mojahedin-i Khalq Iran came under attack by the Iranian government and its leaders were detained and executed but underground activities continued; gradually the orientation shifted to Marxism and the experiences of the revolutions in Algeria, China, Cuba and Vietnam were studied; following the Islamic Revolution of 1979 in Iran the Sazman-i Mojahedin-i Khalq Iran developed rapidly but quickly the new regime appeared to be the new enemy; leaders and activists were detained and executed, other ones escaped to Iraq; in 1997 the United States recognized the Sazman-i Mojahedin-i Khalq Iran as a terrorist organization and in 2002 the European Union did the same.

The Sazeman-e Peykar dar Rah-e Azadi-ye Tabaqeh-ye Kargar was founded as a communist offshoot of the organization of the Mujahedin-e Khalq-e Iran; the Peykar was the weekly political and propaganda periodical of this organization; distanced from the war between Iran and Iraq; in 1981 a number of its leaders and cadres were detained and executed by the Islamic Republic of Iran; gradually Peykar opted for clandestine activities; in the late 1980s Peykar had disappeared from the Iranian political scene.

It covers poetry, novels, short stories and other efforts of creative writing, and a wide range of different magazines, some of which have moved into more mainstream culture. There are also some examples of mainstream magazines (in the way they are produced) who target these 'alternative' youth. No matter how you call it: Independent culture (the definition varies), 'Do-It-Yourself' or DIY culture, in Thailand often known as 'handmade' (as in handmade books), the important connecting element is that of young people who take the initiative to take production matters in their own hands. The collection is mostly limited to print material though. It will be accessible by the end of 2011.

Founded in Amsterdam 1978; aimed to support the anti-nuclear and safe energy movement throughout the world; within a few years WISE branches were founded in Belgium, Denmark, Sweden, Finland, the United Kingdom, France, Italy, Spain, the United States, Australia and Japan; these branches worked practically autonomously and the Amsterdam headquarters became in fact the Dutch branch office; during the 1980s, WISE played an important role in the international movement against acid rain; together with the Friends of the Earth International, WISE started in 1985 the Air Pollution Action Network (AIRPLAN); in 1986 the Information Service on Development, Energy and Armament (IDEA) became part of WISE; in 1988 WISE was one of the founders of Stichting Milieukontakt Nederland-Polen (renamed Milieukontakt Oost-Europa).

Thailand - Elections 2011: Sticker of the 'Vote No' Campaign, initiated by the 'For Heaven and Earth Party', affiliated to the Peoples Alliance for Democracy, otherwise known as Yellow-Shirts. The 'No Vote' should be seen as a protest against the Thai political system which needs to be cleansed of 'bad things'. Cleansing would take 3-5 years and would be taken care of by some sort of (appointed) national Government. The sticker portrays former PM Thaksin (left, deposed by a coup in 2006), and sitting PM Abhisit Vejjajiva (right). The text on the sticker reads: '3 July, the Day to Knock on the Head of a Politician'. In most other PR material the politicians were symbolized as animals (Monkey, Buffalo, Waterlizard etc.). The Campaign was generally considered to have been a failure.

### 3. Image & Sound

#### Akbayan – Citizen's Action Party

As part of the first deposit of the Akbayan archives we received a collection of around 3100 photographs (digital) from the period 1998–2006.

#### Burma Project

From Burma Project (OSI, New York) we received a big collection of video material mostly relating to Burma. The collection consists of documentaries, newsreels, conferences, movies etc. The material is freely accessible but still needs to be processed, and catalogued.

#### Küsters, Tom

Tom Küsters was born in Groesbeek in 1943. Although he died in this same town in 2008, he was deeply involved in the world outside the Netherlands throughout his active life. In the 1970s he participated in the Vietnam movement in Nijmegen and produced a series of posters on the subject. The Vietnam War intrigued him. He built a model landscape of Dien Bien Phoe, where French colonialism in Indochina collapsed. Armed with ordnance survey maps that now pertain to the archive corresponding with the model, he examined the situation on site. Küsters was also interested in the rise and murder of Lumumba. The work of art, featuring 120 portraits of people involved in this case, is part of the collection. Non-political work of Tom Küsters, who was also a skilled marathon runner, is now at the

Valkhof Museum in Nijmegen. The IISH collection consists of the scale model and related documentation, screen prints and printed materials.

#### **Nava Sama Samaja Party (NSSP, Sri Lanka)**

About 100 posters from the late eighties until now covering the party’s activities.

#### **Papua Cultureel Erfgoed (PACE) - Oral History**

Twentyeight interviews (66 tapes) as part of the reserach for the book “Papoea - Een geschiedenis” (Papua - A History) by journalist and former Jakarta-based correspondent of NRC-Handelsblad Dirk Vlasblom. The interviews with Papuans, Indonesians and Dutch have been recorded in the years 2000-2004. Topics covered in the interviews: the Second World War in former New Guinea, the developments resulting from that, the longing for Independence and Papua Nationalism.

#### **Pirnazar Diaspora Radio Archive**

Collecting documents on the political and cultural activities of the Iranian diaspora has been one of the IISH enduring tasks. Following the Revolution of 1978-1982, some 2-4 millions Iranians left for Western Europe and North America creating a dynamic diaspora. In California, the Iranian diaspora gradually developed as one of the major ethnic groups. The Pirnazar Radio Archive includes a collection of audio materials extracted from Radio Iran based in Los Angeles during the period 1980-2005. It includes interviews with the political and cultural elite of the Iranian activists covering a variety of issues from memoirs to analysis of the political and cultural campaigns.

133 posters (doubles) from his collection.

#### **Red Shirt Movement, Thailand**

#### **Photo Collection Ewald Vanvugt**



Collection of black-and-white photographs and negative prints from Ewald Vanvugt (Den Bosch, The Netherlands 1943), socially concerned writer and photographer. From 1963 Vanvugt published a series of novels, short stories and poems. Later on he also wrote books and articles on work ethic, slavery, opium traffic and colonial history. During the sixties, seventies and eighties he travelled among others through India, the United States of America, South-America, Indonesia and Persia. In 1983 during six months he lived on the Indonesian island Bali. At the end of the eighties he travelled through the Soviet Union. In 2003 he toured South-Africa and Namibia. About his adventures during his trips he wrote countless travel stories. During his travels Vanvugt extensively took photographs of social issues: this he called 'the wonder everyday world of beggars, pot smokers, drinkers, child labour, lepers, women's labour, transvestites and a lot more. Some photos were published in different Dutch magazines and papers, like Vrij Nederland, VPRO-gids and de Volkskrant.
